January program

Our January program is about a site we are all familiar with. All of you I am sure have driven the back way to Savannah past Hutchinson Island. The Charleston & Savannah Railroad was operated by the Atlantic Coastline Railroad (ACL). It ran south through Lobeco, Coosaw, Pitchard, and Levy and crossed Hutchinson Island into Savannah. The railroad, completed in 1860, spanned more than 100 miles across rice fields, salt marshes, and seven rivers and creeks. Through service ended in 1971 when the left bridge at Savannah was destroyed by a ship collision. All service was stopped in 1977 and tracks were removed by 1982. However, the route can still be traced using Google Earth.

Vital Rails is an excellent study that explains the importance of the Charleston & Savannah Railroad in the Civil War. It was designed to revitalize the economy of South Carolina's low country by linking the key port cities. With the onset of the Civil War, the railroad became an integral part of the Confederacy's military, economic, and communications efforts along the coast and was a frequent military objective of Union assaults. The author, David Stone, is our speaker tonight. He will focus on the people who were involved with the railroad and will also discuss some of the military engagements that involved it. The book is available through both Amazon and Barnes and Noble.

The battleground is located at 325 State Park Rd., Ehrhardt, SC 29081 This free site is open 9 am to 6 pm daily

Getting there: it is located an hour and 15 minutes from Beaufort county. Take either U.S. 21 or U.S. 321 north to U.S. 601. Then take S.C. 641 north and follow signs.

The site preserves the location of this battle and also provides visitors with an experience in the outdoors that brings history and nature together. When you arrive, you can visit a small cemetery and a monument park, honoring the fallen. Interactive displays and information take you on a self-guided tour along the old Orangeburg road to the Salkehatvhie River Swamp. Further along an extensive earthwork trench has been preserved. Rivers Ridge is one of several South Carolina parks that encourages our four-legged family members to also visit. So, take the whole family.
