Our February program will feature a 25-year resident of Hilton Head, who has spoke at Life Long Learning, Marriott groups, Rotary dinners and Continuing Care Communities. He is a graduate of Dartmouth College and received is hMBA from Drexel University.

His talk will be about Hilton Head Island, before, during and after the Civil War. You can expect to learn about the golden age of sea island cotton and its dependence on slavery, the Battle of Port Royal and its consequences, the seven-year Union occupation of Hilton Head Island and Beaufort, the Battle of Fort Pulaski, the Port Royal Experiment (cornerstone of Reconstruction), J=Mitchelville (first self governed freedman community), and the Gullah movement.

146th Annual Confederate Memorial Day Service

The Rivers' Bridge Confederate Memorial Association is sponsoring the 146th annual Confederate Memorial Day Service on May 13, 2022. The public is invited.

The service, which will be held at the Memorial Grounds located at The Battle of Rivers' Bridge State Historic Site, will begin at 10:00 a.m. with a prelude of period musical selections by Dr. Jim Dreyfus followed by the main program at 11:00 a.m.

After the program the traditional dinner on the grounds will be available for a nominal fee.

The Memorial Grounds are located on the property of Rivers' Bridge State Historic Site at 325 State Park Road, near Ehrhardt, SC, which can be accessed from either the Rivers' Bridge Road or Highway 641.

The Rivers' Bridge Confederate Memorial Association has held this memorial service annually since 1876 to commemorate the battle and its Southern dead.

Rivers' Bridge State Historic Site is managed and interpreted by the South Carolina State Park Service. In addition to the Memorial Grounds, the Park Service maintains the well-preserved remains of the Confederate earthen field fortifications overlooking the Salkehatchie Swamp.

You want to take the Hwy 321 route, which takes about an hour and a half; there are shorter routes, but those have more turns.

Without the efforts of a few Federal officers and about 1,500 former slaves in Hilton Head and Port Royal in mid-1862, the regiments of black soldiers raised in the North following Emancipation may never have had the opportunity to demonstrate the full value of African-Americans as fighting men. Learn how the 1st and 2nd SCVAD paved the way for the 54th Massachusetts and other US Colored Troops' regiments to earn fame and glory in later battles of the Civil War.
